### 2.0 Selection to the Team:

2.1 New Zealand are permitted to enter a maximum of two Swimmers per Individual Swimming Event at the Championships.
2.2 Swimmers are permitted to nominate as a selection event any FINA approved event between 2nd August 2021 and 11 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ April 2022, in addition to the 2022 NZ Championships (Olympians may also use times from the 2021 Tokyo Olympics to achieve qualification, see priority 1 and 2 below).
2.3 Swimmers are to notify SNZ of the FINA Approved event they wish to use as a Selection Event no less than 7 days prior to the start of the event.

### 2.4 Priority One

Swimmers who finish in $16^{\text {th }}$ place or higher at the Tokyo Olympics (Selection Event 1) and achieve a time faster than or equal to the time(s) in Table 1 above in the corresponding event and are the highest ranked NZ swimmer in that event at the Tokyo Olympics will be automatically selected.

After selection criteria 2.4 Priority 1 has been applied, the following selection priority will apply:

## Priority Two

Swimmers who achieve a time faster than or equal to the time(s)
in Table 1 above at any of the following:

- The Tokyo Olympic Games where the athlete was either not placed in the top 16 or was not the highest ranked NZ swimmer in that event at the Tokyo Olympics. (Selection Event 1)
- the FINA approved meet that the swimmer designated as a Selection Event to SNZ (Selection Event 2)
- The NZ Championships (Selection Event 3)

Should more swimmers achieve a qualifying time than there are slots available under Priority 2, the $\operatorname{Swimmer}(\mathrm{s})$ with the fastest times will be selected: except
i. If there are more than two swimmers eligible after applying this criterion, then the Swimmers second fastest times at the Selection Event(s) in the Individual Swimming Event will be used to determine which swimmer(s) are selected; except
ii. If there are still more than two Swimmers eligible after applying this further criterion the Selectors shall consider the following Specific Selection Factors to determine which Swimmer(s) will be selected.
a) any other performances or results in competitions / events in addition to the Selection Event(s).
b) The potential of an Athlete for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.
c) adequate fitness and a commitment to maintain a fitness and training programme as agreed with the applicable coach(es).
d) demonstrated good behavior, including a commitment to training and attendance at training camps.
e) demonstrated compatibility with others in a team environment.
f) demonstrated compliance with the rules of events and competitions.
g) understanding and respect for the obligations that accompany being a member of a New Zealand team when competing at the Championships, including respect for team members and support staff.
h) willingness to promote Swimming New Zealand in a positive manner.
i) demonstrated ability to take personal responsibility for self and their results.
j) proven ability to be reliable; and
k) any other factor(s) the Selectors consider relevant.
2.5 Relay splits and other split times will not be considered for selection for individual events.

### 3.0 Development Consideration:

3.1 Following the selection of Swimmers under 2.0 above, if there are spaces available, consideration for selection of additional swimmers will then be given to swimmers born 2001 or later (male) and 2002 or later (female), if they record a time equal to or better than the times listed in table 2:

5.2 Relay Only Athletes: As per FINA By-Law 9.3.6.3 a maximum of two Relay Only Athletes who have not achieved selection for Individual Swimming Event (s) can be selected as part of a Relay Team. However, the Relay Only Athlete must have achieved a time equal to or better than the times detailed below (FINA B) in the relevant Individual Swimming Event at the Selection Event that corresponds with the Relay Event or, in the case of the Medley, the leg of the Relay Event in which they seek selection.

5.3 For the purpose of each Relay Team only: In a situation where there are no Swimmers who have achieved individual selection under 2.0 \& 3.0 , plus the selection of two relay only athletes as per the above 5.2 , and provided the final relay time is still equal to or better than the times in table 4 then:
5.3.1 Swimmers may be considered for selection to the team for an individual swimming event having achieved a time equal to or better than the times in Table 5 (FINA B standard) in any event (at the Selection Event) only if there are spots available in that event following the selection of swimmers under 2.0.and 3.0 above. In such case this swimmer shall also be able to swim the individual event at the Championships for which they have been selected for but shall not be permitted to swim in any additional events.
5.4 Final Composition of Relay Team: The final composition of the Relay Team(s) at the Games will be determined by the Swimming Team Leader at the Championships, in their sole discretion, in accordance with FINA rules and regulations.
5.5 For all Relay Teams, In the event of an injury or late withdrawal the next fastest swimmer available and eligible will be considered for selection.

8.0 Extenuating Circumstances
a) If a swimmer is unable to compete at the Selection Event due to extenuating circumstances (as set out below), the SNZ Selectors may consider previous performances within the 12 months prior to the Selection Event in a long course event at a competition acceptable to the SNZ Selectors and the SNZ CEO. If the
previous performances are to be considered, then the fastest qualifying time, irrespective of where it was achieved, shall have priority.
b) Swimmers must advise SNZ of the extenuating circumstances and reasons, in writing, with as much notice as possible before the commencement of the selection event(s). If SNZ is not notified of any extenuating circumstances before the selection event (s) in accordance with this selection criteria, then the SNZ Selectors have no obligation to rely on such circumstances.
c) In considering the selection of Swimmers in accordance with the selection criteria, the SNZ Selectors may, in their sole discretion, give weight to any extenuating circumstances which may include, but are not limited to, the following.

- Injury or illness.
- Travel delays.
- Equipment failure.
- Bereavement or personal misfortune; and/or
- Any other factors reasonably considered by the SNZ Selectors to constitute extenuating circumstances.
d) In the event of illness or injury, swimmers will be required by the SNZ Selectors to provide a medical certificate and may be required to undergo an examination by a health practitioner/s nominated by SNZ, and to provide that opinion and/or report to the SNZ Selectors including an indication of the current and future performance impact of the condition. Any failure to agree to such a request may result in the SNZ Selectors being unable to consider the injury or illness as an extenuating circumstance.
e) Selection of any swimmers, as outlined above, will be subject to confirmation of their satisfactory return to training. This process is to include a test in the swimming event that they have been selected for. The test must be performed by a designated date decided by the SNZ Targeted Program Manager. A target time indicating satisfactory progress will be decided and announced to the swimmer before the designated date.
