	<ul> <li>Be a <u>female aged 13 to 16 years or male aged 14 to 17 years</u> as at the first date of the State Teams Age Group Championships 2019 (4<sup>th</sup> October 2019)</li> <li>Be a New Zealand citizen who is eligible to represent New Zealand in competition as per FINA General Rule 2 (GR2);</li> </ul>			
	<ul> <li>Be a registered and financial member of Swimming NZ;</li> </ul>			
	<ul> <li>Be and remain in "good standing" with Swimming NZ and always comply with any established code of conduct or athlete agreement of Swimming NZ and otherwise conduct themselves in a way that does not bring their sport or the team into disrepute;</li> </ul>			
	<ul> <li>Not used or administered any substance which, if it had been detected as being present in the athlete's body tissue or fluids, would have constituted doping, or used any prohibited method or committed any other doping offence as defined in Swimming NZ's or FINA's Anti-Doping Bylaw.</li> </ul>

- **1.3** Selection and ranking of the Swimmers shall be determined in the following priority order using Table 3.
  - i. Swimmers that achieve both time standards from table 3 in an event pairing from table 2.
    - I. Should more than one swimmer achieve both time standards in an event pairing, the swimmer with the fastest times in both events shall be selected.
    - II. If there is more than one swimmer eligible after applying this criterion, the swimmers' second fastest combined times at the Selection Event(s) in the Event Pairing will be used to determine which swimmer(s) are selected; except
    - III. If there is still more than one swimmer eligible after applying this further criterion the Selectors shall consider any other performances or results in competitions / events they consider relevant;

	<ul> <li>b) If a swimmer who has been invited to attend the ASTC squad camp is unable to attend due to extenuating circumstances (as set out below), the Swimming NZ Selectors may consider any performances at the NAGs Selection Event and any previous performances within the 12 months prior to the NAGs Selection Event in a long course event at a competition acceptable to the Swimming NZ Selectors and the Swimming NZ CEO.</li> <li>c) Swimmers must advise Swimming NZ of the extenuating circumstances and reasons, in writing, with as much notice as possible before the commencement of the selection event(s). If Swimming NZ is not notified of any extenuating circumstances before the selection event (s) in accordance with these selection criteria, then the Swimming NZ Selectors have no obligation to rely on such circumstances.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>d) In considering the selection of Swimmers in accordance with the selection criteria, the Swimming NZ Selectors may, in their sole discretion, give weight to any extenuating circumstances which may include, but are not limited to, the following;</li> <li>Injury or illness;</li> <li>Travel delays;</li> <li>Equipment failure;</li> <li>Bereavement or personal misfortune; and/or</li> <li>Any other factors reasonably considered by the SNZ Selectors to constitute extenuating circumstances.</li> </ul>
	e) In the event of illness or injury, swimmers will be required by the Swimming NZ Selectors to provide a medical certificate and may be required to undergo an examination by a health practitioner/s nominated by Swimming NZ, and to provide that opinion and/or report to the Swimming NZ Selectors including an indication of the current and future performance impact of the condition. Any failure to agree to such a request may result in the Swimming NZ Selectors being unable to consider the injury or illness as an extenuating circumstance.
	f) Selection of any swimmers, as outlined above, will be subject to confirmation of their satisfactory return to training. This process is to include a test in the swimming event that they have been selected for. The test must be performed by a designated date decided by the Swimming NZ Targeted Program Manager. A target time indicating satisfactory progress will be decided and announced to the swimmer before the designated date
