Eligibility	 To be considered for selection, a swimmer must: Be a New Zealand citizen who is eligible to represent New Zealand in competition as per FINA General Rule 2 (GR2). Minimum ages: Female 14 years of age and Male 15 years of age on 31st December 2021 Be a registered and financial member of Swimming New Zealand. Be and remain in "good standing" with Swimming NZ and always comply with any established code of conduct or athlete agreement of Swimming NZ and otherwise conduct themselves in a way that does not bring their sport or the team into disrepute. Not used or administered any substance which, if it had been detected as being present in the athlete's body tissue or fluids, would have constituted doping, or used any prohibited method or committed any other doping offence as defined in SNZ's or FINA's Anti-Doping Bylaw. 		
Team Commitments	 All swimmers selected must: always comply with the provisions of the SNZ Code of Conduct conform to SNZ requirements regarding team participation. This includes, but may not be limited to, providing an acceptable IPP, attendance at a pre-event camp and wearing team uniform as required. make themselves available for all team activities designated by SNZ. be available compete in relay events that do not interfere with individual races. not act in such a manner as to bring themselves or SNZ into public disrepute. 		
Selection Standards	 1.0 1.1 To be considered for selection for an individual event at the 2021 FINA World Championships (25m), swimmers must record a time equal to or better than the times detailed below in the relevant Individual Swimming Event at a Selection Event subject to Clauses 3 and 8 below. 1.2 Extenuating Circumstances: In any decision regarding the selection of swimmers to the team, the Selectors may, in their sole discretion, consider any extenuating circumstances in accordance with clause 8.0 below.

2.0 Selection to the Team:

2.1 In accordance with FINA rules, New Zealand is permitted to enter a maximum of two Swimmers who have achieved a FINA A time or better OR one swimmer who has achieved a FINA B time, per Individual Swimming Event at the Championships.

2.2 Priority one:

Swimmers who achieve a time in Table 1 in the female elite / male elite column at the Tokyo 2020 Summer Olympic Games in 2021 and were placed in the top 16 and were the highest placed New Zealand swimmer in that event, shall take the priority on selection to an individual event.

If there are more swimmers achieve the standards above than spots available, then selection will be prioritised by the closest FINA A time achieved in the corresponding event and course (LC or SC) to its World Record.

Priority two:

Following the selection of the athletes under priority one above, if there are spaces available, <u>consideration</u> for selection of additional athletes will then be given to athletes who achieve a time equal to or better than the times detailed in Table 1 or 2 female and male elite standards at *any* LC or SC FINA approved event for the purpose of the World Championships (25m) between the qualifying period -6^{th} October 2020 -25^{th} August 2021.

If there are more swimmers achieve the standards above than spots available, then selection will be prioritised by the closest FINA A time achieved in the corresponding event and course (LC or SC) to its World Record (World record as of the final day of qualification period).

Priority Three:

Following the selection of the athletes under priority one and two above, if there are spaces available, *consideration* of selection of 1 additional athlete per individual event (per FINA Rules) will then be given to athletes born 2000 or later (male) and 2001 or later (female), if they record a time equal to or better than the times listed in Table 1 or 2 under Female / Male Development standards at *any* LC or SC FINA approved event for the purpose of the 2021 FINA World Championships (25m) between the qualifying period – 6th October 2020 to 25th Aug 2021, and did not compete at the 2021 Olympic Games.

2.3 Should more swimmers than there are spaces available achieve a qualifying time as per the above in Priority three the swimmers closest



to the FINA A in the relevant individual event and course (LC / SC) will be selected.

- 2.3.1 If there are more swimmers eligible than spaces available after applying this criterion the swimmers' second fastest times at the Second Selection Events (in the Individual Swimming Event will be used to determine which swimmer(s) are selected; except
- **2.3.2** If there are still more swimmers eligible than spaces available after applying this further criterion the Selectors shall consider the following Specific Selection Factors to determine which Swimmer(s) will be selected.
- **2.3.3** any other performances or results in competitions / events in addition to the Second Selection Event.
- **2.3.4** adequate fitness and a commitment to maintain a fitness and training programme as agreed with the applicable coach(es).
- **2.3.5** demonstrated good behavior, including a commitment to training and attendance at training camps.
- **2.3.6** demonstrated compatibility with others in a team environment.
- **2.3.7** demonstrated compliance with the rules of events and competitions.
- **2.3.8** understanding and respect for the obligations that accompany being a member of a New Zealand team when competing at the Championships, including respect for team members and support staff.
- **2.3.9** willingness to promote Swimming New Zealand in a positive manner.
- **2.3.10** demonstrated ability to take personal responsibility for self and their results.
- **2.3.11** proven ability to be reliable.
- **2.3.12** and any other factor(s) the Selectors consider relevant.
- **2.4** Relay splits and other split times will not be considered for selection for individual events nor for selection to relays.

3.0 Additional Events or as part of a Relay Team:

3.1 Any swimmer who is selected for the World Championships team in an individual event or relay event may be able to swim an additional event(s) and be used as part of a relay team where there is an available position and at the agreement of the Team Head Coach and the Targeted Athlete & Coach Manager.

4.0 Relay selection:

Selections for relay teams will be made from within the team selected for individual events at the championships.
