Warm-up and Warm-Down Procedure

SNZ will use the standard Warm-up Procedure for all National Competitions. Details of the Warm-up procedure are on the SNZ website. Warm down will be in the programmes pool.

Marshalling Process

Marshalling for the meet will take place in the marshalling room.

Swimmers will be sent out to the starting blocks by the clerk of the course who will be on hand to supervise. Swimmers are asked to be in the marshalling area 4 races ahead of their own race. For 50m events swimmers must marshal six races before their race.

Pool Access/Entry

Access to the pool for swimmers and managers attending the Championship is through the southern entrance of the pool on Kilbirnie Crescent. All swimmers, coaches and managers will be supplied with an event pass. This must be displayed when entering the pool. If you don't have a pass you will be required to pay the spectator entry fee. Entry into the pool for spectators is through the front entrance.

Collection of Packs

School packs can be collected from 8am on Friday 9 September from the control room. Packs will include the programme for session 1 and event passes.

Team Managers meeting

There will be a team managers meeting on Friday 9 September at 8.15am in the marshalling room. It is compulsory that all team managers attend this meeting so that processes can be explained and it is a great chance to ask any questions you may have face to face.

Officials meeting

An officials meeting will be held on Friday 9 September at 9.15am in the marshalling room

Nibbles will be served for officials throughout the sessions. We ask all officials to bring their own water bottle. There will be volunteers to refill these if required.

Seating

Seating will be allocated for schools by regions. Seating will not rotate. The seating plan will be available on the SNZ website and will be displayed around the venue.

Session Programmes

Session Programmes, DQ Forms, and Penalty Forms will be available for pick up in the region boxes.

Conditions

The Secondary School Championships will be conducted in accordance with the Swimming New Zealand Regulations as published on 22 July 2016 and FINA Rules. All events will start promptly. Competitors must be ready when called, or the event will start without them. Relay names must be in to the control room 30 minutes prior to the session starting.

Timed Finals

Seeding of timed-finals will be according to the submitted entry times, the fastest group of swimmers shall be placed in the last heat, the next fastest group of swimmers in the penultimate heat, and the next fastest in the preceding heat etc until all swimmers are assigned a heat. This may result in a swimmer swimming in a heat by themselves.

Protests

Protests must be lodged in accordance with SNZ Regulations. Protests will be as detailed in SNZ Regulation 4. The fee for a protest is \$100.

Withdrawals

Withdrawals are detailed in SNZ Regulation 3. The fine for failure to withdraw from a final is \$50. Note: All NZ Secondary School events are timed finals and SNZ Regulation 3 applies to all events. 3.2 For timed finals, withdrawals must be advised by the end of the session preceding the start of the timed final event.

Results

Results will be posted as soon as possible in the complex and on the SNZ website at the completion of each session.

Live Results

SNZ will have Live Results on the SNZ website. The results for each event will be uploaded once the event has been signed off. Results will also be available on the Hytek 'Meet Mobile' application that can be downloaded to your smartphone.

Timelines

Timelines will be included on the session sheets. The times shown are approximate and races may start before or after the times indicated. It is the swimmers' responsibility to be at marshalling at the appropriate time.

Session Programmes

Session programmes will be available for purchase for \$3.00 at the main entrance of the pool.

Parking

Parking is readily available at the rear of the complex and surrounding streets of Kilbirnie.

Victory Ceremonies

Swimmers who are not present will not receive their medal. Substitutes may be used if swimmers are in other races or in marshalling, however they must be of the same gender as the swimmer due to be receiving the medal.

Victory ceremonies will take place immediately after the following race – please see the Victory Ceremony Timetable on the SNZ website.

A musical fanfare will be used to indicate the Victory Ceremony.

<u>Immediately after finishing their race and before warming down</u> the top 3 swimmers should dry down, get their tee shirt or tracksuit jacket and go to the presentation area. They must advise the presentation official they are present.

Swimmers who are not present will not receive their medal. Substitutes may be used if swimmers are in other races or in marshalling, however they must be of the same gender as the swimmer due to be receiving the medal.

Dress standard for victory ceremonies

- School t-shirt, jacket or sweatshirt.
- No caps or goggles.

- No towels to be wrapped around the waist.
- Tracksuit bottoms or shorts are NOT required.

We will endeavour to run the victory ceremonies as timetabled. If for any reason there is a delay in the results being available, the victory ceremony for that event will take place as soon as possible. The victory ceremonies will continue to happen as timetabled.

Team managers and Coaches are to ensure swimmers are familiar with this protocol and timetable, which is on the SNZ website.

Skins

Participants in the skins races will be determined by the placings of swimmers in the corresponding 50m events. Skins races are open to all ages and the top 8 swimmers have the first opportunity to compete. Lists of the top swimmers will be placed on a notice board with alternates immediately following the individual races. If a swimmer does not want to compete in the skins event their team manager must complete a withdrawal form within 30 minutes of the results being posted.

The skins will be run in the following format. Each event will start with 8 swimmers. They swim 50m with the slowest two swimmers dropping out after the first heat. This continues until there are only 2 swimmers remaining and they swim off to be the skins champion. From the start of the previous race the successful swimmers have 2 minutes until the next race starts. They must exit the water and return to the start end to begin the next heat.

There are prizes for the first four swimmers in each of the skins races that will be presented at the conclusion of each session.

Disqualifications

Disqualifications will be announced and a copy of the DQ form available from the Control Room.

Banner placement

SNZ will have signage at the Secondary School Championships. This signage will take precedence for position over other banners.

Trophies and Certificates

The top boys and girls school will be presented with a Trophy to be returned after one year. Standard SNZ points will be used to find the top school. Individual, para swimmer and relay races all count towards school points, but skins races do not. Certificates for the Secondary School Championships will be awarded to the top 8 swimmers in each age group and will be sent to schools after the meet.
