PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2014/15

During the past year our numbers have remained fairly constant in most areas. The hard work is continuing and a big thank you must go to our loyal and long-serving staff. Our stadium still remains in limbo – we have had recent discussions with the Council but at the moment there is no definite news about its fate. In the meantime we are concentrating on our Learn to Swim programmes, technique and competitive squads.

We were very sorry to say goodbye to Tatiana this year – she had been with us for 10 years and was a very respected coach. Tatiana's husband obtained work in Perth which necessitated the move to Australia. The club held a farewell which was very well attended with lots of fond memories. Gifts were exchanged and Tatiana left with some lovely Kiwi memorabilia.

Our squads continue to feature in the top 10 in New Zealand and this is all down to our squads working hard under the guidance of our coaches. A big thank you to Martin Harris, our Head Coach, for his continued good work and towards the end of the season we welcomed Euan Johnston from Scotland who has fitted in very well and is a replacement for Tatiana. During the year we also welcomed Gabriella Benesova from the Czech Republic and she has made an excellent contribution not just to the squads but also helping with the schools programme together with Euan and our other coaches.

A big thank you to parents who have come forward to manage our teams and also to officiate as required at swim meets. Great to see and much appreciated.

What can I say about our staff at Wharenuī..... they are hard working, loyal and very welcoming to everyone that comes through the doors. Jackie, the General Manager who has been with us for 20 years works very hard to make sure we make use of our pool space as economically as possible. Fiona, our Learn to Swim Co-ordinator and Secretary – always there to make sure we fit everyone into classes and making sure our swimmers get entered correctly in our swim meets. There is always something on. We cannot forget Richard Doak, our Financial Officer – although Richard now lives in Akaroa he comes into work 2 days a week and makes sure we haven't been spending too much money!! His expertise is very valuable to the financial running of the club and the auditors are very pleased with his presentation of accounts at year end.

This year has seen our Wharenuī Waterpolo working much closer with Canterbury Water polo and we watch with interest as this moves forward.

As we go to print, there are two items I need to make mention of:

1. Our 52nd Wharenuī Winter Olympics will take place at the end of this month.
2. What a wonderful effort from our swimmers with the 40hr Famine – swimming for 40 hrs. To William Campbell and his team – well done and great to see more than \$5000 raised for a very worthy cause.

Head Coach's Report

Another year at Wharenui has whizzed by and what a year it has been! With the recent departure of our long serving Assistant Coach, Tatiana, Euan Johnston has stepped into that position and is forging ahead with the Junior Squads. A warm welcome to Euan and we hope he enjoys getting to know the greater Wharenui family over the coming months. We have also welcomed on board Gabriella Benesova who is working in the Technique / Junior areas.

At the beginning of this year the Development Squad camp was again held at the Wharenui Swimming pool from 6th - 11th January. Much hard work was put in by the swimmers over that week with the aim of gearing up for the DIV IIs.

The National Squad had their camp at the Maori Hill Complex in Timaru as preparation for the upcoming NAGS and Open meets. Timaru Girls' High accommodated us and in an effort to try and keep costs to a minimum, we opted to self-cater this year which worked out well. Most swimmers managed to complete 13 sessions and over 110km in the pool that week. Again we cycled to and from the pool for each session. This is always a very successful camp and enjoyed by all who attend. The living away from home creates good supportive team spirit and I am proud of how our swimmers conducted themselves over this week. Fun activities outside of the swimming programme included dodge ball, cricket, soccer & PS4!

This year the NZ Junior Champs took place in Wellington from 20th - 22nd February. Wharenui was represented by 4 swimmers who came home with 3 medals; 1 gold, 1 silver and 1 bronze.

Div II's took place in Dunedin from 18th - 21st March. Our tally was 12 gold medals, 11 silvers and 10 bronzes. The results were impressive with Wharenui achieving top club out of 80 clubs. We received an award for our efforts which is hanging in my office. What a great exit for Tatiana! A real high note to leave on and we wish her all the best for her relocation to Perth.

Wharenui sent an 8 strong team of swimmers to the 2015 Open Champs in Auckland from 14th - 17th April. 21 pbs were achieved and we finished 11th Club overall. Matt Hutchins won the bronze medal in 400 free and the 4 x 200m free relay team (Matt H, Jordan, Matt P, William) won the silver medal.

Wharenui sent a 13 strong team of swimmers to the 2015 National Age Group Champs in Wellington from 5th - 9th May. We achieved 48 PB's and came home with 3 golds, 2 silvers, 7 bronzes and a ranking of 8th club in NZ out of 80 clubs.

Wharenui Swim Club put their own spin on this year's 40 Hour Famine which took place in May. Starting at 4pm on Friday night 42 swimmers from the club took part in a 40 hour swimathon. Most swimmers got a maximum of six hours sleep over the 40 hours, and the group managed to clock up more than 700km by 8am on Sunday morning. Their efforts raised more than \$5,600 for this year's World Vision campaign, which aimed to raise funds for vulnerable children in Bangladesh. Well done team, a great effort in organising and completing this mission.

SCWC Tri Series 7th-10th July

Tri Series History:

The SCWC Tri series replicates the format and programme of the competition between Australia and New Zealand held since the early 1990s. This is an international age group six meet team racing series with the teams all travelling and staying together. This series was unfortunately cancelled after the 2013 competition.

Swimming NZ also internally replicated the series from 2009 to 2011. There have been many SCWC athletes and coaches involved in both competitions over the years.

SCWC Tri Series Objectives and Overview:

The inaugural SCWC Development Tri Series Tour was held from Monday the 7th of July to Thursday the 10th of July.

The Tri-Series Tour is primarily designed to meet the following objectives:

- Develop the competition pathway
- Seek continued improvement from swimmers at new level of competition
- Develop a Regional culture amongst our swimmers
- Exposure to different coaching and management styles
- Athletes to develop a set of coping strategies that they can use when moving through to next level of the pathway
- Coach Professional Development
- Experience for Team Managers at a new level and competition type

Overview:

The Silver and Bronze squads were divided into three teams allocated to two coaches and a team manager with an overall tour director travelling with the team.

The tour travelled to Oamaru where they raced that evening before staying together at St Kevin's College. There was another racing session the next morning in Oamaru before the teams travelled to Timaru to race again that night and stay at Timaru Boys High School. After the fourth session of racing in Timaru the next morning the teams travelled to Ashburton for the 5th race session, staying at Coronation Park. The final session of racing was set for Thursday morning and after lunch the group returned to Christchurch. Ashburton and Timaru swimmers departed the tour directly from Ashburton.

All of the swimmers' events and relay teams were selected by the coaching staff of each team with the emphasis on scoring points for your team.

Blurb from Tatiana:

For the fourth year the Development squad camp took place in Wharenui swimming pool, it was again very convenient, as we were able to reach out to all of our swimmers. The attendance rate was 100%. The main focus of this camp was hard training and getting the best times at Canterbury A's. Some swimmers were preparing for Division II competition and the Age Group champ time. This was a good opportunity to get to know your swimmers on a different level and to strengthen the team's spirit. The camp included swim sessions which were held twice a day and an hour of exercising on dry land. The total distance covered this week was 54 km. Much has been done, but all the kids were happy, no one complained and I can say that the group has become more friendly which is pleasant.

Canterbury A's - Dunedin 21st - 25th January

Wharenui was represented by 34 swimmers. We stayed in the Carrington Hall which was nice and close to the pool and catered well for us. Wharenui achieved 38 gold medals, 25 silver medals and 15 bronze medals, bringing the total medal tally to 78, and 165 PBs. We achieved a very convincing first place ranking with a total of 1854 points, over 650 points ahead of Jasi who came second.

For the 6th consecutive year Wharenui won the Hollander Cup (15 x 50m freestyle relay). We had so many good swimmers to choose from it made picking the team very difficult. Our final swimmer came in almost a full length (45m) in front of the next contender from North Canterbury. Tatiana and I were in the pool with the team to celebrate the win fully clothed.

Congratulations to those swimmers who have now qualified for the NZ Juniors, NAGS, Div II's and Opens. I'm sure we'll see lots of good results this year to keep us at the top of the table. Not forgetting a big thank you to our Team Managers, Sarah Garriock and Leanne Whittington, and to all the swimmers' families who make events like this come together so well

The portfolio has performed well this year, increasing in value by over \$20,000. Although interest rates have remained low throughout the year the trustees have managed to increase the distribution to the club from \$6,000 last year to \$6,250. The strong return this year is partly attributable to the two investments we have in the international share markets which have both produced returns of over 20% for the year. Several fixed interest investments we have rolled over during the year have been able to receive slightly better rates than the year before.

Last year we reported that our foray into the Government SOE sell-down had not been as successful as had been hoped with the total return for the first year of ownership being - 7%. This year the trustees have been rewarded for their patience with a return of close to 50% for the year.

At 31 March the Trust had 38% of the portfolio in fixed interest investments, predominantly with banks (last year was 42%), 14% in property (last year 13%) and the remaining 48% in New Zealand and overseas shares (last year 45%).

Sue Williams is due to retire by rotation and is making herself available for re-election.

I wish to thank all the trustees for the time and expertise they have contributed this year.
